

## Unified Local PTA/PTSA Unit Bylaws Bylaw Amendment Recommendation Process

**BYLAWS** — The document containing the basic rules of the organization: defining its primary characteristics; how the organization functions; and, includes rules the organization considers so important that they cannot be changed without previous notice to the members and a vote — in a manner specified in the bylaws themselves. Bylaws cannot be suspended. All local PTA/PTSA units in Arizona are governed by the same set of Unified Local PTA/PTSA Unit Bylaws. Amendments to the Unified Local PTA/PTSA Unit Bylaws can be made **only** at the annual Arizona PTA Convention.

## HOW TO SUBMIT A BYLAWS AMENDMENT RECOMMENDATION

Recommendations for amendments to the Unified Local PTA/PTSA Unit Bylaws may be submitted by:

- Any current PTA/PTSA member of an Arizona PTA/PTSA local unit.\*
- A PTA/PTSA local unit affiliated with the Arizona PTA.\*\*
- A PTA/PTSA council affiliated with the Arizona PTA.\*\*
- The Arizona PTA bylaws committee.
- The Arizona PTA Board of Directors.
- \* If a recommendation is submitted by a PTA member, that person must identify the PTA/PTSA local unit in which (s)he is a member.
- \* \* If a recommendation is submitted by a PTA/PTSA local unit or council, a copy of the minutes of the meeting at which the recommendation was approved must be included. The minutes must clearly indicate that a quorum was present.

## WHAT HAPPENS RECOMMENDATIONS/PROPOSALS FOR BYLAWS AMENDMENTS?

Each amendment recommendation is reviewed and discussed by the Arizona PTA Bylaws Committee. The committee may:

- Accept the proposed amendment as submitted.
- Make changes to the proposed amendment.
- Combine two or more related proposals.
- Reject any proposed amendment.

At the winter meeting of the Arizona PTA Board of Directors in January 2016, the Bylaws Committee will make its report. The Board of Directors, when acting on the report, may:

- Propose an amendment.
- Place any proposed amendment on the convention agenda.
- Make changes to any proposed amendment.
- Reject any proposed amendment.

The Arizona PTA Board of Directors makes the final determination as to which recommendations for amendments to the *Unified Local PTA/PTSA Unit Bylaws* will be placed on the 2014 WSPTA Convention agenda. Article 14 of the *WSPTA Uniform Bylaws* governs amendments to the *WSPTA Uniform Bylaws*.
