Elections — 2018-2020 Term

Per Arizona PTA Bylaws adopted June 1, 2013, Article VIII, Section 1.f., Any member planning to run from the floor for a position must advise the Arizona PTA President twenty-one (21) calendar days before the first general session of the annual Arizona PTA convention.

The slate of officers for the 2018-2020 term is as follows:

The following provisions shall govern the qualifications and eligibility of candidates for election. (Arizona PTA Bylaws, Article VIII, Section 2. a, b, and c):

Secretary: To be eligible for nomination to the office of Secretary, a person must have a background of at least two (2) years accumulated local PTA/PTSA unit, council, region, or state PTA experience. This position is exempt from the requirement of the Arizona PTA Board of Managers experience. **Treasurer:** To be eligible for nomination to the office of Secretary, a person must have a background of at least two (2) years accumulated local PTA/PTSA unit, council, region, or state PTA experience. This position is exempt from the requirement of the Arizona PTA Board of Managers experience. This position is exempt from the requirement of the Arizona PTA Board of Managers experience. To be eligible for nomination as Treasurer, a person must have a background in bookkeeping or finance. **Region Director**: To be eligible for nomination to the office of region director, a person must have a background of at least two (2) years accumulated local PTA/PTSA unit, council, region, or state PTA experience. To be eligible for nomination to the office of region director, a person must have a background of at least two (2) years accumulated local PTA/PTSA unit, council, region, or state PTA experience. Region directors shall be elected by the delegates from their respective regions at the annual Arizona PTA Convention. A region director's nomination must be signed by a person within their region. (Arizona PTA Standing Rules, amended September 2008, Article XII, Section 7. g) . **Note**: Only members in the same region can nominate a member for the position of Region Director.

In addition to the above- mentioned criteria, to be eligible for nomination, a candidate must be a member of an Arizona PTA local unit in good standing. A candidate must reside in Arizona (Arizona PTA Bylaws, page 8 Article VIII, Section 1 for complete information). *In regard to experience, a year shall be defined as twelve (12) months of service from the date of assuming office or appointment by the President. (Arizona PTA Bylaws, Article VIII, Section 2, Page 9)

Duties and Responsibilities of Positions

These can be found in the Arizona PTA Bylaws, Article IX: Duties of Officers, pages 10 and 11, and in Article X: Board of Managers, page 12. The Positions of Secretary and Treasurer are considered members of the Executive Committee and those duties can be found in the Arizona PTA Bylaws, Article XI: Executive Committee, page 13. The position of Treasurer is considered Chairman of and considered a member of the Budget Committee and those duties can be found in the Arizona PTA Bylaws, Article IX, Section 5, page 11, and Article XII, Section 4: Budget Committee, page 4.

If a member is interested in a position listed, they can be nominated from the floor at the First General Meeting during convention, June 8, 2018. Member must advise the Arizona PTA President no later than May 19, 2018, emailing the appropriate forms to nomination@azpta.org. Member must meet the qualifying criteria which shall be verified by the Nominating Committee. The following provisions shall govern the qualifications and eligibility of candidates for election.

Arizona PTA Resolution for Adoption

The following new Resolution will being presented to the Convention delegate body on June 8 during General Session 1 for consideration as an addition to the Arizona PTA Resolutions. This resolution will be voted upon on June 9 during General Session 2 by the delegates.

RESOLUTION: Arming School Teachers

WHEREAS, teachers are not trained to be law enforcement officers and the State of Arizona and Local School Districts do not have the money or resources to provide proper training, and

WHEREAS, it would be extremely difficult for law enforcement officers to determine who was legally armed during a crisis, and

WHEREAS, accuracy, when firing a gun, is reduced during periods of high stress, and

WHEREAS, the responsibility of teachers should be to protect those students in their classrooms, not to get involved in a shooting incident and,

WHEREAS, other safety measure, including metal detectors, locked door access, and bag checks should be used to keep students and staff safe, and

WHEREAS, since 2013, there have been 291 shootings on elementary, middle, and high school and college campuses in the United States which averages to about one per week,1 and 168 of those shootings were at K-12 schools; and

WHEREAS, teachers carrying guns could be overpowered by a student or a group of students, and the weapons could fall into the wrong hands, be it therefore

RESOLVED that the Arizona PTA and its constituent associations supports the employment of armed highly trained and certified professionals, including School Resource Officers (SROs), as the only armed personnel to aid in the safety of our students, and be it further

RESOLVED that the Arizona PTA and it constituent associations urge Law

RESOLVED that the Arizona PTA and its constituent associations encourage local policy makers to support policies that increase the number of counselors and social workers available on school campuses to work with at risk students, and be it further

RESOLVED that the Arizona PTA and its constituent associations encourage policy makers to support legislation to increase school security in ways that do not include arming teachers or bringing in armed volunteers to provide school security.

The following are the proposed amendments to the Arizona PTA Legislative Platform Priorities. These amendments will be presented at General Session 1 on June 8, 2018 and voted upon at General Session 2 on June 9, 2018.

Insert 15, 16, 17, 18 under Health and Safety

15. Supports legislation regarding the proper use of infant/toddler car seats, child booster seats, and seat belts to reflect what is nationally recommended by both the National Highway Traffic and Safety Administration as well as the American Academy of Pediatrics.

16. Encourages awareness about the proper use of sunscreen and protective clothing when children are exposed to the sun as suggested by the American Academy of Pediatrics and the American Cancer Society.

17. Encourages the development of programs within Arizona's schools to educate students, families and the community regarding excessive heat days and/or excessive ultraviolet index days.

18. Support and encourages education and awareness of the signs of heat-related illnesses and encourage proper hydration.

Insert 6 under Family and Community Engagement

6. Supports increasing community awareness and establishment of legislation regarding leaving children unattended in vehicles, particularly during times of extreme temperatures.



Convention FAQ's

WHO SHOULD ATTEND CONVENTION?

At the Arizona PTA annual convention, the delegates shall include any member of a local unit including but not limited to the President, Vice President, Secretary, Treasurer, and any other elected/appointed board member. Priority should be given to new and returning board members. Training opportunities are offered for all board members. See your bylaws for more info!

WHO PAYS FOR A DELEGATE TO ATTEND CONVENTION?

Arizona PTA strongly encourages its local units to allocate for as many attendees as entitled to attend the annual convention. Training is an <u>authorized and legitimate</u> PTA expense and should be budgeted. Officers not only get assistance on how to perform their duties and fulfill their roles, but receive **mandatory training** about how to advocate, determine what programs best fit their school and community, and is an investment in all children and families. The convention expense should be a line item in a PTA budget. Training is necessary and **mandatory** to run an effective and successful parent association.

WHAT IF OUR ELECTIONS DO NOT OCCUR PRIOR TO THE EARLY REGISTRATION DATE? Local

units can submit registration forms with unnamed delegates to represent their unit at the annual convention. Once the new officers are elected, submit the names to Arizona PTA with all the necessary details. Remember, only members who have joined prior to March 1 can participate in voting during General Sessions of Convention.

WHAT TO BRING AND THINGS TO KNOW

- Plenty of great eateries and the hotel shuttle is available to transport you and your board to the Carefree local restaurants for dinner or if you bring your family, events for them too!
- Invite your principal, district superintendent, teachers, counselors and parents to attend the Saturday Awards Dinner and Ceremony.
